Morning Assemblies

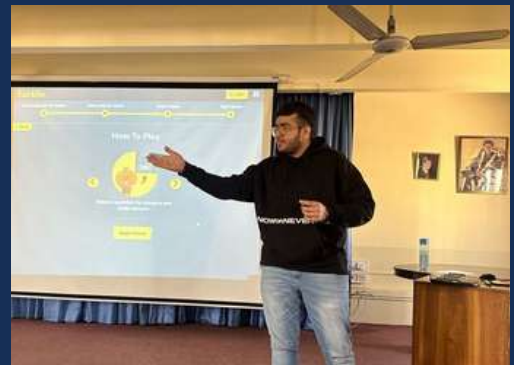


Reflection

Excursions and Outings



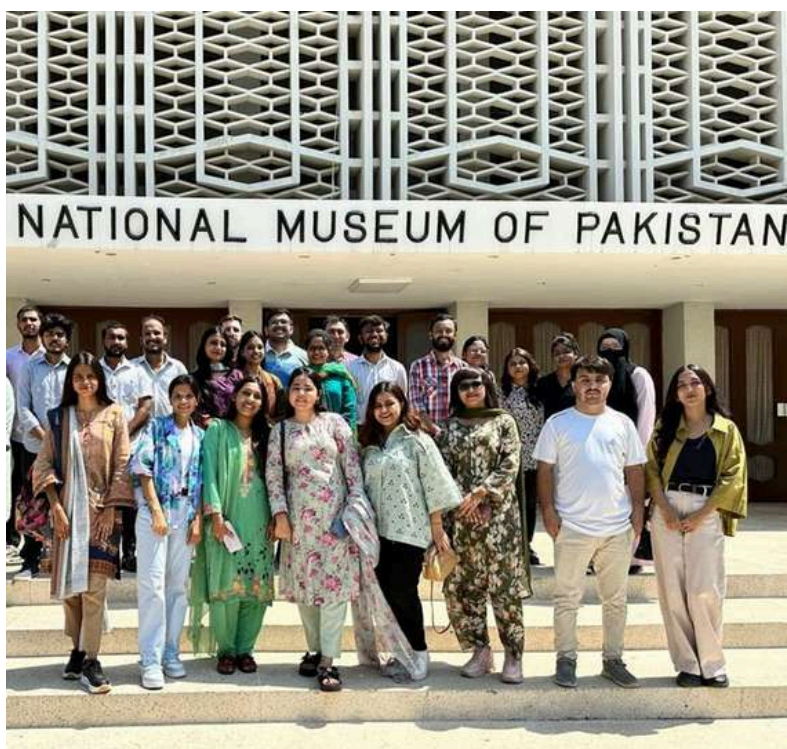
State Bank Museum

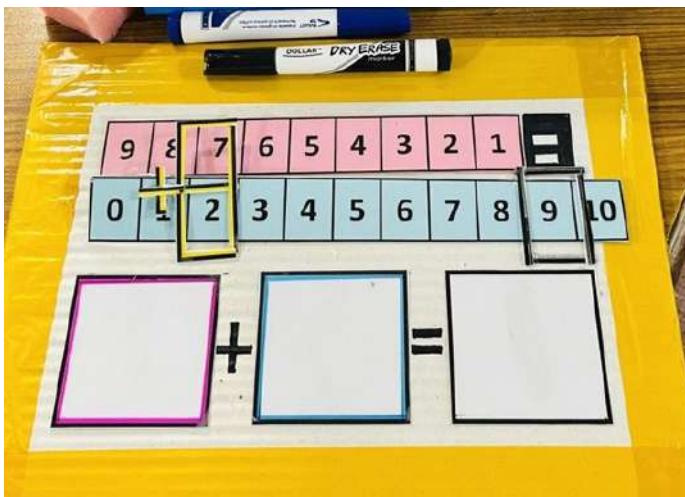


Ethical Leadership

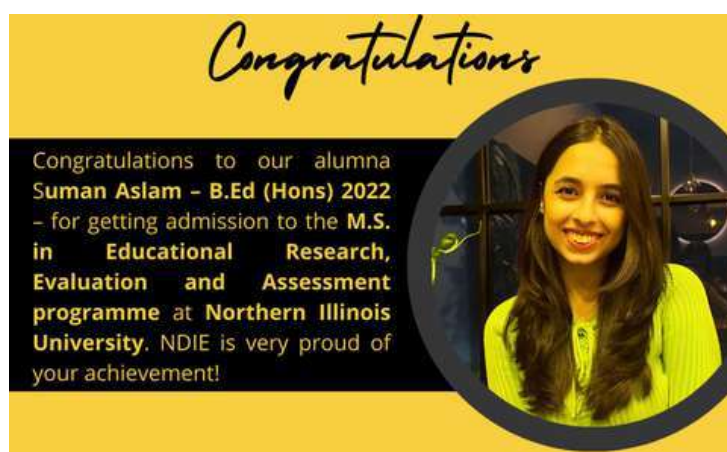
